Create a text frame and select the font *F25 Bicolored Border*.

The font size should be set to e.g. 24 pt or bigger.

Please set the line height exactly to the same size e.g. 24 pt.

To get an overview how the font works please enter:

## Bicolored Border - First Step

Create a text frame and select the font *F25 Bicolored Border*.

The font size should be set to e.g. 24 pt or bigger.

Please set the line height exactly to the same size e.g. 24 pt.

At first you will create a border with the first color.

To get an overview how the font works please enter:

a    b    b    b    c

d    *sp*    *sp*    *sp*    e

d    *sp*    *sp*    *sp*    e

f    g    g    g    h        *sp*: Space

Changing the font size and line height and entering more characters and lines you can create various sizes of labels.

## Bicolored Border - Second Step


Copy the text frame and select all text in this frame.

Exchange the color with the second colour of the border  
(e.g. 80 Magenta).

Please select *All Caps* in the *character* menu.

Now please select both text frames and *align* them (*top* and *left*).  
Make a group.

The result should be a border or a label with a border like the example on the next page.



## Bicolored Border

If formatting in uppercase letters isn't possible you can enter the uppercase letters manually in the second text frame, e.g.
